The Seduced Soul

- I. Background of Psalm 24
 - a. It is part of a group of messianic psalms 22-24.
 - b. When Herod's Temple was built psalm 24 was sung every Sabbath
 - c. The Early church read Psalm 24, Forty days after Easter, the day Jesus ascended.
 - d. This is a psalm David wrote as they brought the Ark into Jerusalem to prepare their hearts for worship

- II. Do not worship an idol.
 - a. You were created to worship. Psalm 24:1-2
 - b. Exodus 20:3-4 warns us against idolatry. (See also Deuteronomy 4:19)
 - i. the Word Vanity/False, is Idolatry in Deut 4:19
 - ii. Idolatry seduces us. Seduced means we can't see our own idols.
 - iii. You can identify what you worship by the sacrifices you make, money spent, and time.

- III. Allow your heart to draw to God.
 - a. Identify the Idols of our soul. Ps 24:3-4
 - b. Seduced Souls are Actors at Masquerade. Mark 7:6-7, 2nd Corinthians 11:14,15
 - c. Transparency-key to a walk with Jesus Col 3:2; Lk 16:15

- IV. For the sake of your soul. Tear down the Idols
 - a. The result or ridding your life of idols. 24:5-6
 - b. Psalm 24:7-10 When we lose Idols, We get the privilege to celebrate what is important.
